



**Instructions for New Users
Mac
(Summary)**

This set of instructions is meant for those that are already connected to Internet through another provider or do not need to install TCP/IP or PPP software. These instructions have been left as general as possible given the vast number of possible TCP/IP and PPP interfaces you may be using. Apple has gone through at least 5 sets in the last 18 months, not to mention the assortment of third party products. If you need help, please call, we have seen most of them and will be able to help you if you get stuck.

1) If you are allowed to have the server assign DNS numbers, use this option (sometimes called a bootp server). If the setup requires DNS numbers, using the reference information provided in the previous message, enter the Primary DNS (name server) address in your TCP/IP, MAC TCP, or OT/TCP configuration. If there is a place for a secondary DNS number, enter that as well.

2) If a list of 'domain search orders' is requested, use kw.igs.net as the first and only one. In the old MAC TCP, you have a screen which requires:

```
kw.igs.net      216.58.99.2    default
.              216.58.1.2
```

Note the . and the line that is set to be the default.

3) Set the method for obtaining an IP (address) to server assigned, this is NOT the same as dynamic.

4) In your dial-up package (Config PPP, FreePPP, MacPPP, OT/PPP, etc.), set the number to dial to be that noted on the reference information.

5) Your login method does not require a script and may be called 'direct', 'PAP', or 'PPP'.
